**51<sup>ST</sup> NATIONAL SHOOTING DOG CHAMPIONSHIP**

**One-Hour Heats • Entry Fee: \$225.00**

**Prizes:** Specially crafted bronzes and \$1,500 purse divided \$1,000 to the Winner and \$500 to the Runner-Up, if named.

**Qualifications for National Amateur Shooting Dog, National Amateur All-Age and National Shooting Dog Championships:**

*Qualification for life*—A) A win—Champion or Runner-Up—in an NGSPA or American Field Championship of an hour or more in length.

B) A win—1st, 2nd or 3rd—in a broke dog stake in any NGSPA or American Field sanctioned trial.

The current year's NGSPA Futurity winner qualifies for next year's Championships (one year only). Dogs must be amateur handled and amateur owned in the National Amateur Shooting Dog Championship and National Amateur All-Age Championship. Dogs must be *FDSB* and DNA registered.

**NGSPA policy for the Amateur and Open Championships stakes will be: "A qualified dog may be entered in only one Amateur National Championship stake, and only one Open National Championship stake. The class of the stake (All-Age vs. Shooting Dog) may be changed between the Amateur and the Open Championships." NGSPA policy states that entry fees shall be paid for all dogs drawn and payment must be received before the dog competes.**

**— NOTE ENTRY DEADLINE: MONDAY, MARCH 9 —**

All Nationals entries for any dog that, at any time prior to March 6, has qualified to enter any National event, must be received by the NGSPA Field Trial Secretary by March 9. Dogs that first qualify on or after March 6 may be entered at any time before the drawing is held, but information for the dog may not be published in the National events catalog. Phone entries will not be accepted. Entries must be on an entry form and include all information, including the *FDSB* registration and DNA numbers, date and trial of qualification. If information on where and when the dog qualified is not on the entry form, dog will not be drawn!

Drawing for the National Amateur Championship will take place at approximately 6:00 P.M., Friday, March 27.

Drawing for all other stakes will be held on the grounds no later than the night before the stake begins.

There is no training or roading on the grounds for a two-week period before the trial begins.

This trial is run under the minimum requirements of the *FDSB* and the NGSPA rules and regulations.

A current negative Coggins Test and Health Certificate for horses are required by Missouri law. This is being enforced by the appropriate State personnel.
